
The tables were decorated with bright autumn leaves and lighted pumpkins, carved out by Lorraine Doganieri. She also made the wreath on the front door.

The Board members really came through as a team this year, inspiring ideas, supporting one another, and occasionally meeting downtown for more inspiration.

We presented 19 events this year, many especially for kids: Movie Nights, the Easter Egg Hunt, Pumpkin Carving and a grand Holiday Party with Santa driving up in a constable's car with sirens blaring. Trains rumbled down their tracks all around the Community Center during our first Toys for Tots initiative. We hosted family events: a Pancake Breakfast, Yard Sale, Mather Hospital Walk, Concert, Pot- Luck Supper, Residents' Party, and two educational programs - Boating Safety and a historical presentation by Nancy Orth. Adults enjoyed the Garden Tour, and Lobster Bake.
